Over a three day period (Sunday 24th to Tuesday 26th June) the Plumbing Sheetmetal Coppersmithing Instructors Association (PSCIA) held our annual conference at the Albury Commercial Club. This is the 32nd consecutive year we have had the conference at the Commercial Club.

The Association was formed in 1956 in an era when the plumbing trade was taught in tertiary colleges, particularly in regional areas and also in many technical schools. In these institutions, most teachers taught both junior classes and apprentices. As a result, the Association dealt with a wide range of issues, including the teaching of the secondary and apprenticeship curriculum.

The Association brought teachers together for social activities, industrial visits, excursions and in-service programs both in the metropolitan and regional centres, covering topics of interest to secondary and apprenticeship teachers. It also became a valuable source of general information, materials and equipment.

Since these early days plumbing training has needed to change to meet the training requirements of the now National Training Package. The Albury conference helps the current trainers meet and maintain a constant training standard across Victoria.

The 2018 Albury conference saw 115 plumbing trainers from Victoria, Queensland, New South Wales and South Australia, government departments and industry supporters.
